FY 2011 Fulbright Teacher Exchange Program: S-ECAAS-11-CA-0017
Period of Performance: October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2015

On June 30, 2011, Family Health International purchased the assets, programs, and expertise of the Academy for Educational Development (AED), and rebranded the broader organization as FHI 360. In March 2012, FHI 360 completed a sub-award agreement with the Institute of International Education (IIE) that transferred the administration remaining program activities of the FY 2011 Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange Program to IIE, as well as administration of all ECA-approved alumni activities.

The Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange Programs supported classroom-to-classroom exchanges and provided research opportunities to a select group of U.S. and international gifted teachers. The long-term anticipated results of the Fulbright Classroom Exchange and Distinguished Awards in Teaching were to improve mutual understanding among teachers, administrators, and their schools and communities in the United States and abroad, to ensure that the positive impact of the Teacher Exchange Program continued to be visible to the public in United States and host school communities, enhanced pedagogical techniques, and shared new cultural perceptions that will benefit students for years to come. In addition, program activities were focused on creating an active alumni network that will cost-effectively sustain long-lasting relationships.

FULBRIGHT CLASSROOM TEACHER EXCHANGE PROGRAM (CTE)

The 2011-2012 Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange included 46 U.S. teachers and 48 international teachers who travelled to/from seven participating countries, including two one-way exchanges from Mexico. The period of the exchanges was from August 2011 to July 2012. As of September 30, 2012, all participants had returned to their respective home schools and countries.

FULBRIGHT DISTINGUISHED AWARDS IN TEACHING PROGRAM (DA)

In 2011-2012, 17 U.S. teachers and 20 international teachers participated in the program from 9 different countries. The number of participating U.S. teachers was originally 18; however, one program was cancelled for a U.S. to U.K. exchange. The period of the exchanges was from August 2011 through August 2012. As of September 4, 2012, all participants had returned home. The host university for the international teachers was the Office of International Initiatives in the College of Education at the University of Maryland, College Park (UMD). Three of the 17 U.S. teachers conducted their programs in their host countries during fall 2011, while the remaining 14 teachers completed their programs during various intervals in spring 2012. All international teachers completed their program at UMD in fall 2011.

ALUMNI ACTIVITIES

In addition to completing alumni follow-on projects and participating in professional development activities, program alumni were included in application development, program candidate review, participant orientation sessions, and a variety of program outreach activities.
